# A NOTE FROM OUR EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR



The past three years have been extraordinary for the Kids' Fund as we navigated many obstacles to continue supporting children with special needs across British Columbia. Despite the pandemic, multiple natural disasters, and soaring inflation, we increased our individual grants by twenty-five percent over the year before. I am very grateful for the generosity of our donors who opened their wallets and their hearts to help meet the need of the families and children hardest hit by these challenges.

The Kids' Fund is one of the largest individual funders for children with special needs in the province, which combined with our inclusive criteria for funding, make us a lifeline for many families. In 2022, we saw a rise in requests for counselling to help children with mental health needs cope, as well as requests for speech, occupational, and other therapy programs to help kids continue to build essential life skills. The biggest increase was in grants for tutoring and education, with requests more than doubling from pre-pandemic numbers.

We could not have met this demand without the support of our donors, partners, and sponsors. Because of you, families in BC can count on the CKNW Kids' Fund to help ensure

their child has a brighter future. Thank you!

# **INDIVIDUALS**



**\$122,871** for wheelchairs, mobility aids and other specialized equipment which helped **54 kids** 



**\$27,359.65** was designated to accessible transportation and other necessary supports for **7 kids** 



**\$327,000** supported education through specialized tutoring and tuition for **191 kids** 



**\$618,990** helped children access a wide range of therapies including music therapy, physiotherapy and clinical counselling for **232 kids** 



\$50,749 gave access to equipment and services like assistive technology and respite care for 37 kids








### INDIVIDUAL FUNDING
